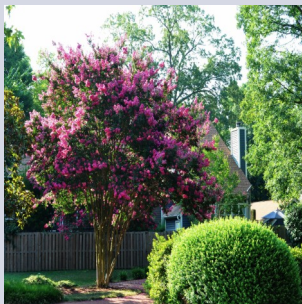


From the President's Corner

Otherwise, the homeowner must get permission for tree removal from the Board and be willing to pay for the removal.



Needless to say, another summer like this one will mean that we really need to urge all of you to water the shrubs and trees in your cluster. There is a community water source near your mail kiosk that has been provided for that very purpose. This water is paid for by the HOA. A parched tree or shrub is more vulnerable to invasive pests as well.

Fall Leaf Collection

This fall the landscaping company is working with us to make leaf collection as painless as possible. Those of you who live around the perimeter of the property often have definite requests about the naturalized property behind you. Several years ago, when the landscaping budget was cut in half, a decision was made by the Board to blow leaves into naturalized areas where possible as a cost saving measure. Many residents were not happy about this.

So – we need to hear from you now! Do you mind if leaves are blown into the naturalized area in back of your home? If we don't hear from you, we will assume it is OK. Or, do you absolutely want all the leaves cleared from the area in back of your house. Or maybe just not blow any extra leaves back there. Would you like to have shredded leaves put in an area around your home to build up the soil? Many bare areas would benefit from this kind of coverage.

Recycling Corner
